From Mr. Boss' Desk:

Chinook City Schools Severe Weather Policy

In the event of extreme cold temperatures, or adverse road conditions, it may be necessary to cancel bussing. The Swift Current City School busses will not run when the morning when the temperature is -40 degrees Celsius, or when the wind chill is -45 degrees Celsius or below.

Adverse road conditions and limited visibility can also factor into the decision of cancelling the school busses.

A decision to cancel the city of Swift Current routes is made by the manager of transportation in collaboration with the Director of Education. The cancellation of bus routes is made by 6:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. The notification is made to administrators, bus drivers and families through School Messenger, Chinook School Division website and social media pages.

In adverse weather conditions, special collector stops may be utilised by the manger of transportation.

Please note that only the busses will be cancelled, all city schools remain open, including the Comp High School. Parents always have the right to keep their children home during severe weather conditions, especially if they feel their child's safety may be in jeopardy due to the weather.

November In Motion Commotion
